



**AREA 1B MINUTES**  
**Monday, June 26, 2006**

The meeting was called to order at 7:37 p.m.

**Minutes:**

Minutes of the March 27, 2006 meeting were approved as printed.

**NAGM Recap**

All RC's and board members must re-do volunteer forms each year. Registrar is now a required board position. There are two new National board members. Section 1 received "Section of the Year." Jeff Hull asked each region for their opinions on the Tri-Section Conference in April. Please see attached summary of the discussion.

**Treasurer's Report:**

Lisa May presented the Treasurer's Report for April, May and June 2006. The ending balance was \$8108.80. Expenditures for April 2006 were \$143.00 for stationary and \$57.37 cell phone, for May 2006, \$65.00 for cell phone and for June 2006, \$505.26 for the Area 1B dinner at NAGM. Receipts of \$310.00 were collected for CEL season/tournament fees from Region 661. Regions 3, 583, and Area 1U still owe for CEL season/tournament fees.

**Fall Season**

Ken reminded everyone that he needs updated guidelines at the next meeting from each region. If a region does not turn in a signed copy, they will revert back to the standard guidelines.

Ken asked each region how many teams they will have for upper division Fall play. Darryl reported that Diamond Bar will have 2 each for U19 and 3 each for U16. Juan reported that Chino will have 2 each of U19, possibly 3 U19 boys, 3 U16 boys and possibly 5 U16 girls. Greg reported that Chino Hills will have 2 or 3 U19 boys, 3 U19 girls, 3 or 4 U16 boys and 5 U16 girls. Chris reported that South Ontario will have 2 U16 girls and 2 U16 boys, possibly 1 U19 boys. Tom said that Claremont will not have any upper division teams. Pomona region will be starting at U14 and below.

Juan stated that he had reserved Ayala for two nights a week, two fields, 6:15 pm and 8:00 pm times. He has Villa available all the time. Darryl said that he has Petersen on Monday, two fields, as well as Pantera. He also has some fields for Sundays. Greg has Grand Avenue park, four time slots on Tuesday nights, as well as Saturdays.

There was discussion on how to be sure that the upper division teams will be able to play 10 games. It was suggested that play start in August, by the 21<sup>st</sup>. Ken needs to know field availability in order for this to happen. Season play needs to be done by November 11 and 12, 2006 and the tournament will be on November 18, 2006.

**Inclusion of Area U in Fall Play:** There was concern regarding Area U making their referee assignments. It was also pointed that many Area 1B teams have trouble making the drive to some of the

Area U fields, such as Newton, but Walnut Ranch is not that far. Ken asked for a vote on whether to include Area U in the Area 1B upper division Fall season with the conditions that Area 1B teams only go to fields as far as Walnut Ranch, Area 1B teams referee at their own fields and that Area U pay the fall season fees up front. The motion passed. All were in favor.

**Regional Commissioner Reports:**

**Region 31** – Darryl reported that the region is planning to start an AYSO adult league. They are still waiting for approval from National. It will be a pilot program, administered completely separate from the region. The Cottontail Classic tournament went well, each spring team earned \$1400.00. The region has grown approximately 10%, they have 1290 registered so far. Their U14 team had to withdraw from the National games. They will be holding a BASIC class this Wednesday, June 28, 2006, at the AQMD at 7:00 pm. Lisa asked Jeff if National will be requiring that U12 teams at tournaments be 9 v. 9. They need to know in order to get their tournament packets together. Jeff said he will ask National in mid-July. Jeff stated that it needs to be brought up at the NAGM, a proposal to mandate that U12 stay 11 v. 11. However, Darryl pointed out that at National, commissions are circumventing the vote of the executive membership. Darryl also reported that on September 30, the region will be having a “Silent Saturday,” where parents and coaches are not to talk or clap.

**Region 67** – Juan had nothing to report.

**Region 779** – Greg reported that their U16 boys will be going to the National games. The Kickin’ it in the Hills tournament went well, they had their biggest numbers ever, 122 teams. Registration is up, approximately 2700 now, they expect 3000. He said that they were having problems with the eAYSO system aging the children into the wrong division. They are trying to test it.

**Region 583** – Chris said that the final registration numbers are up also. Many from the Eastvale area are registering in the region. She reported that the Spring season went well. The coaches are doing better with more training. She also told Jeff that she still wants the registration money back from the Arrowhead Tournament.

**Region 3** – Tom Babineau reported that enrollment is about the same, about 1300-1400 children. They CEL season went well for them, the coaching program has improved. They have a new board with about 30% turnover.
